The trouble of course is, that the quality of a paper or an investigator cannot be judged by a Journal Impact Factor.

So, you may wonder how you can help the Society improve the impact factor of *The Bulletin of Mathematical Biology*? Please carefully consider the references in your manuscript. Do not hesitate to cite scientifically relevant articles from *The Bulletin of Mathematical Biology* when you are preparing your next manuscript to be submitted to our Society journal or to any other journal. This might entail digging into *The Bulletin of Mathematical Biology*, and by doing so discovering a jewel for your research.

The Bulletin of Mathematical Biology, and the Society for Mathematical Biology need your support. We hope you will consider this when writing and submitting your research works.
